

#### **National Pony Society (NPS)**

NPS Qualifying Rounds: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in any of the British Riding Pony studbook sections or the Ridden Register; the GSB; the AHSB; the AASB, or registered in the main body of their respective M&M Stud Book. Part breds are not eligible unless overstamped into one of the British Riding Pony studbook sections. or the Ridden Register. Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members but only ponies owned by adult NPS Qualifying or Life members are eligible to qualify for the final of the competition at the NPS Summer Championship Show at Malvern from 5<sup>th</sup>-7<sup>th</sup> 2025. The highest placed pony, if owned by an NPS member, in each class will qualify for the final. Qualification may pass down to third place if the first and second ponies are already qualified. NPS/WTJ Insurance Brokers LTD Home Produced Ridden Championship - Riders of Home Produced ponies (see definition in the NPS Rules Book) can wear a white arm band in classes where this is indicated. These ponies. if owned by NPS members, are then eligible to qualify for the final at the NPS Summer Championship Show. The Owner's Membership cards MUST be produced in the ring when requested or the qualification will be forfeit.

#### **Shetland Pony Stud Book Society**

- 2.3 Classes must be confined to SPS-BS registered ponies. Ponies must be named on the entry form and in the catalogue if one is produced. Society rosettes must only be given to ponies registered with the Society or to foals eligible for registration.
- 2.4 Three-year-old fillies with foals at foot may not be shown. All foals must be a minimum of three weeks old on the day of the Show.
- 2.5 To enter a stallion in ANY class (in-hand or performance) at an affiliated show, entire males aged 4 years old and over must have an "S" number and have been successfully through either the SPS-BS Stallion assessment prior to 2006 or the current SPS-BS Voluntary Veterinary Examination. Ridden stallions MUST display a stallion bridle badge. In hand colts/stallions of two years old or over must be shown bitted and are advised to display a colt or stallion bridle badge, these are available to purchase from the SPS-BS.
- 2.6 There must be no colts or stallions in Young Handlers classes. Young Handlers must be a minimum of 3 years of age on the day of the show. Children under 14 years

old may not show colts (excluding foals) or Stallions in In-hand classes. Children aged under 12 years old on the day of their class may not show a stallion in ridden classes. In the interests of safety, hard hats conforming to current British Safety standards must be worn, correctly secured, by all handlers aged 14 years or under in In-hand classes. For Health & Safety purposes judges and exhibitors must remain standing whilst in the ring when showing ponies. KNEELING IS NOT PERMITTED. Hard hats conforming to current British Safety standards must be worn, correctly secured, by all exhibitors, irrespective of age, in ridden classes. Ridden and driven ponies must be 4 years old or over. In ridden Classes, if a rider falls off at any time whilst in the ring, both pony and rider must leave the ring, rider dismounted, and take no further part

An amateur is a person who for the purpose of RoR classes does not/has not during the current season or previous season: Engage (d) in breeding, livery, buying or selling, dealing or hiring horses in a commercial capacity. Horses must not have been stabled at or reside in a Professional Producer's/Trainer's yard from January 1st, 2024. Riders must not have ridden any animals produced by a Professional/Trainer in the current or previous season. Horses and riders must not receive any help from a Professional Producer/Trainer at a SHOW in the current season. A rider who has ridden for a Professional/Producer Trainer in the current or previous season must not have ridden horses at a show. Any breaches of this ruling will be taken seriously and will result in disqualification from future classes.

#### Class 24 TATTERSALLS ROR OPEN IN HAND SHOW SERIES QUALIFIER 2026

Open to all RoR and NR competition registered horses, 3vrs and over, fillies, mares and geldings. Handlers must be 15 years or over on the 1st January 2025.



- 1. Committee reserve the right to exclude any person from the show if they deem it fit.
- 2. Any exhibitor lodging a protest must first deposit 40 pounds (£40) with the Secretary which will be forfeited to the funds if the claim is not sustained. All protests must be in writing and received within 1 hour of the class.
- 3. The Secretary must report any protests or disputes to the Show committee whose decision on the day will be final. In case of an objection being sustained against any entry, the prize will be given to the next in merit, if commended by the judge.
- 4. In the event of the need for a referee judge, that judges decision will be taken as final.
- 5. The Committee will not be responsible for any incident arising from any cause connected with the Show and it shall be a condition of entry. This rule will be strictly enforced.
- 6. Competitors are strongly advised to have adequate public liability insurance in place.
- Riders of horses should wear hats which conform to the relevant British Standard for the activity.
- 8. Competitors are strongly urged to ensure that their horses are up to date with their vaccinations and in general good health.
- 9. Any persons infringing the rules will be excluded from the Show.
- 10. The Committee reserve the right of refusing entry, cancelling or altering the classes and arrangements of the programme, of postponing the Show in the event of unfavourable weather or any unforeseen circumstances.
- 11. All class times are approximate and it is your responsibility to ensure that you are on time for your class.
- 12. All horse and pony prize monies to be collected from the Horse Secretary.
- 13. All entries to be Paid in Full before the closing dates. Entries on the day will be cash only.
- 14. No entry fees will be refunded on the Show Day without a current vet's certificate.
- 15. The Committee will not pay for any engraving on cups or trophies.
- 16. In the event of cancellation exhibitors from all sections will receive a 50% refund.
- 17. DATA PROTECTION It is a condition of entry that the Machen Show Society reserves the right to forward Exhibitor information to the press, Breed and Showing Societies and other regulatory authorities (i.e.DEFRA or Trading Standards).

# MACHEN AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY SHOW CODES OF SAFETY

The Members and Committee of Machen Agricultural Society wish to state the following conditions which apply during preparation for the Show during the event itself and while exhibitions are being dismantled. All exhibitors, retailers, caterers, equipment suppliers, event organisers and members of the public should ensure that they comply with all current Health and Safety Executive Legislation and Guidelines and in particular.

- 1. Note should be taken of all Showground signs with special notice to be paid to those denoting areas which access is restricted to members of the public, and / or animals and vehicles.
- No gas appliance or portable generators may be used on the Show field that have not been recently examined and tested by a competent person. Appliances used should be labelled to indicate the examiner's name and date of examination.
- 3. Persons who supply or loan equipment for use by the organisers or members of the public must ensure that it complies fully with current legislation and standards relevant to its proposed use, and that it is properly maintained.
- 4. Any steam or Pressure vessel or lifting appliance used or demonstrated must have undergone a recent inspection, should be labelled accordingly and should be appropriately insured.
- Fairground devices (including all passenger carrying rides) are only allowed on the basis
  that the code of Safe Practice at Fairs' has been observed and understood by all operators.
   (b) Any use of equipment by persons under the age of 13 years of age is prohibited.
- Any accident or injuries should be reported immediately to the Secretary's tent, where First Aid will be available.
- 7. Access to Show Rings is restricted to persons involved in the organisations of the event and exhibitors/competitors.
- 8. All emergency access routes will be clearly indicated and should not be obstructed by vehicles at any time.
- 9. All exhibitors and competitors should be aware of the Show Committee's Health and Safety policy statement, copies of which are available in advance or in the Secretary's tent on Show day. Anyone who breaks the rules of the Society or contravenes any of the conditions laid out in the Health and Safety policy Statement will be asked to leave the Showground.
